



Planting Guide:

The dark green, deeply slit leaves of the pot dill 'Delikat' (Anethum graveolens var. Hortorum) are known for their spicy, aromatic taste. In a sunny spot with humus, loose soil, Anethum graveolens var. Hortorum 'Delikat' usually reaches a height of 50 to 60 cm with its fine, branched to upright growth.

Synonyms

The pot dill 'Delikat' is also called cucumber herb or field dill.

Planting Time

Container plants can be planted all year round, with the exception of frozen ground and summer heat (over 30 ° C).

Maintenance

It is advisable to draw irrigation ditches between the rows, because many types of vegetables should not be watered from above. In addition: Regular weeding prevents the weeds from robbing the vegetables of their strength.

Water

Dill plant needs a lot of water.

Uses

The pot dill 'Delicate' is used in the following areas: vegetable garden, consumption, salad, medicinal plants and fish.

Ground

A soil that is as humus and loose as possible contributes to healthy growth.

Location

The pot dill 'Delikat' prefers to stand in a sunny place.

Leaves

This summer green herb plant has dark green leaves with a spicy, aromatic taste. They are deeply slit.

Growth

As a fine shoot, branched, upright growing plant, the pot dill 'Delikat' reaches a size of 50 cm to 60 cm and is 20 cm to 30 cm wide.
